HAND SPUN

All entries to be made from handspun yarn using fleece from a Breed eligible for the Show (see page one) either alone or combined with other fibres, such as silk, mohair or fleece from another breed. These may be plied, blended, or combined with other handspun yarn, but the whole to consist of not less than 50% Rare Minority or Traditional Breed Wool.

SKEIN OF YARN

Must be handspun by exhibitor within past year using fleece from a Breed eligible for the Show Maximum of 50g or 2 oz, neatly wound.

 Class 133 All wool skein-100% sheep's wool natural coloured, plied.
 Class 134 Blended Skein, at least 50% sheep's wool, designed to show the versatility of wool when combined with other fibres in a smooth, evenly spun standard plied yarn.
 Class 135 Fancy Yarn Skein.
 Class 136 Novice Skein – Novice Spinning for 1 year or less, 100% Sheep wool.

A panel of Judges will be drawn from the breed judges.

If there are sufficient entrants Class 140 may be split into 2 groups Please be sure to state name of Young Handler and animal on entry form. Young Handlers are to handle one animal entered (or eligible for entry) in one of the above showing classes. Judging will be the manner and ability to handle and show Sheep, Pigs, Cattle and Goats and not on the conformation, etc of the animal. A dress code is applied to classes 140 and 141 i.e. not less than expected from exhibitors in the showing classes. Best Young Handler Cattle & Sheep Trophies to be awarded to the first prize winners in classes 139 and 140 will be judged in the Cattle Ring following completion of judging of the Cattle Interbreed Championship

The Best Goat Young Handler Trophy for classes 139 and 140 will be judged in the Goat ring following the Goat classes.

The Best Pig Young Handler Trophy awarded by the Zeuner Family for

Class 140 will be judged in the Pig ring following completion of judging of the Pig Classes. Class 141 for older Junior Stockpersons aged 15 to 16 years with the intention that some animal conformation will be expected and handlers will have some knowledge of their animal charge. The best handler in this class will be awarded the Virginia Lyon Cup for sheep and goats and new trophy for cattle.

The Judge and Show Organisers reserve the right to refuse an individual entry into these classes at the show ground on Health and Safety grounds.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Straw will be provided on cattle lines only.

Washing facilities will be available near the Cattle lines.

Water points will be provided near the sheep and goat pens.

No smoking allowed in the ring or marquees.

Exhibitors, Judges, and handlers must wear white coats in the ring and in the Grand Parade. Whilst in the animal lines all handlers must wear protective coats or overalls.

Animals to be penned by 9am and it is particularly requested that they remain on the show ground until the end of the Grand Parade.

Numbers will be sent out approximately two weeks before the show with a printout of your entry that incorporates a receipt. If you require an earlier acknowledgement for entries please enclose a stamped self-addressed envelope with your entry form.

One car pass will be sent with your numbers. Please contact the Secretary if additional passes are required. All judging will start at 10.30am. (Unless the number of entries is exceptionally large.) The organisers reserve the right to expand, contract or combine classes depending on the number of individual entries.

NOTES FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

MOVEMENT RECORDS

All movement of cattle, sheep, goats and pigs must be recorded in the owner's movement records. Movements of cattle to and from shows must be reported to BCMS within 3 days of movement. Movements of sheep, goats and deer to and from shows must be reported to local authorities on an AML 1 within 3 days of movement. Movements of pigs to and from shows must be reported to

local authorities on an AML 2 within 3 animals or is in anyway unfit for days of movement. exhibition.

IDENTIFICATION OF SHEEP GOATS AND PIGS

Sheep, goats and Pigs moving to and from shows must be identified with an ear tag or tattoo giving the herd of origin and an individual identification number.

All animals must be fully registered in their respective Flock, Stud or Herd books.

Exhibitors' Responsibility: Exhibitors are reminded that they are solely responsible for; and in charge of; their stock at all times whilst they are on the Show ground. They are also responsible for any loss or damage caused by their animals.

Cover for livestock: As it is not possible to provide cover for sheep, goats or cattle we remind exhibitors to bring their own to protect their animals from sun or rain.

Animals sent for exhibition may at any time, on the instruction of the Judges, Director, Secretary, Stewards or Officials of the Show, be inspected by the Veterinary Officer of the Show. The Veterinary Officer will be instructed to order the removal from the show ground of any animal which, in his opinion, is affected by a disease likely to prove harmful to other

Trophies engraved by the 2009 Winners must be returned to the Show Secretary by 9am on Show Day

SCRAPIE, MV & CAE MONITORING NOTE FOR SHEEP EXHIBITORS

Scrapie Monitored flocks: Entries of sheep will be accepted from Scrapie Monitored Flocks but the Weald & Downland Museum accepts no responsibility whatsoever in the event of sheep coming into contact with non monitored stock

All exhibitors are required to make a declaration that no female sheep brought to the show is either in lamb, has lambed within the previous 30 days or subject to procedures that change the seasonal breeding pattern. Please indicate in the appropriate column on the entry form the date on which the ewe is expected to lamb or the date on which the ewe last lambed.

MV accredited sheep cannot be accepted.

Clarification for older lambs

Sheep with permanent incisors erupted are not eligible for entry into lamb classes but should be entered in to the Shearling or Sheep born before 2010 classes as appropriate.

NOTE FOR GOAT EXHIBITORS

All exhibitors are required to make a declaration that each animal entered is non-pregnant (empty) and has not kidded in the previous 30 days.

SGHS Caprine Arthritis Encephalitis (CAE) Accreditation Scheme: All SGHS CAE Accredited goats must be accompanied by an in date green SAC form which must be handed to a steward before unloading. This is a statutory obligation.

The British Goat Society's CAE Monitored Status does NOT equate with the SGH Scheme and the goats must be kept separate.

Please indicate on the entry form to which scheme you belong. This will allow us to provide the appropriate pens.

NOTE FOR CATTLE EXHIBITORS

All bulls over 10 months must have been ringed. Senior bulls should have **TWO HANDLERS IN THE RING. ALL BULLS MUST BE SECURELY DOUBLE TIED AND HALTERED THROUGHOUT THE EVENT**
