

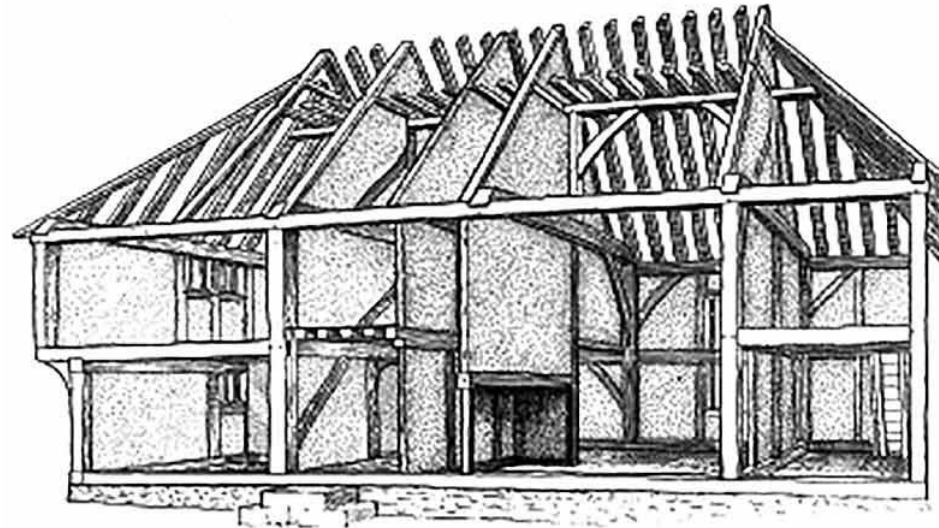
Welcome to the Weald & Downland Living Museum!





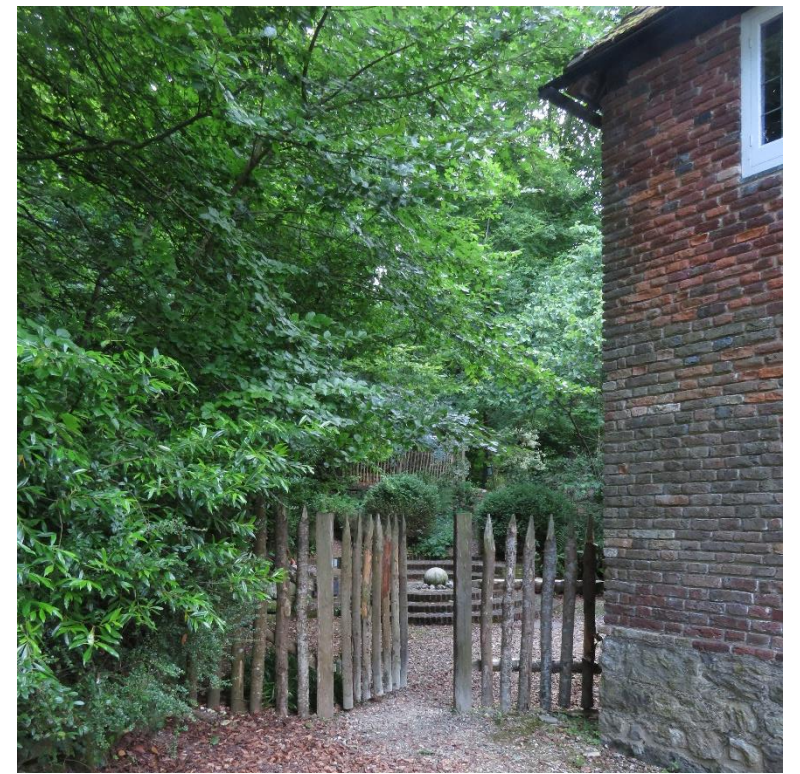
What do we do?

- We rescue old buildings by taking them down and putting them back together again at the Museum - just like a big puzzle!
- You can visit the buildings at the Museum to learn about life in the past.



When you arrive

- We will also show you where the toilets are.



What to expect from a visit: workshops

What to expect from a visit: self-led

- After we have taken you to your base, we will give you a big map and explain what there is to see and do.

- Please ask them questions if you want too.





- There are over 50 buildings at our museum, all from this part of the country,
- These include homes from the Anglo-Saxon, Tudor and Victorian period.
- There are also barns, a mill, a dairy, a bakehouse and even a school!



- And there are animals too! We have geese, chickens, ducks, horses, pigs and sometimes even lambs!



You can buy special food in the shop to feed the ducks. Why not have a go? They are very friendly.
