Cara Elin, a whimsical whirlwind from South Wales. Through her songs, she brings to life the darkest tales of the Mabinogion, painting pictures of misty mountain tops and tylwyth teg.

Jon Wilks is a singer, songwriter and "badman fingerpicking guitarist" (Carl Barât, The Libertines) known for his deeply personal take on English folk music. Formerly an editor at Time Out, he draws on storytelling instincts with songs steeped in memory and place. Two of his albums explored Birmingham's folk heritage, and his 2023 album was The Guardian's Folk Album of the Month. His fifth album (2025) is a patchwork of memories: "what you'd find if you rummaged

around in my head for an afternoon."
